

Mennonite Genealogy, Inc. Research Grant Application

Mennonite Genealogy, Inc. (MGI) is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to encourage interest in Low German Mennonite and Hutterite genealogy. The organization offers a grants program to individuals and institutions/organizations that supports projects related to its purpose. Projects could include:

- The acquisition of primary materials or copies thereof of interest to Low German Mennonite and Hutterite genealogists, such as church, census, civil, and immigration records.
- The extraction of genealogical data from these materials.
- The publishing of genealogical data from these materials.
- The preservation of primary archival documents related to Low German Mennonite and Hutterite genealogy.
- Conferences/seminars related to Low German Mennonite and Hutterite genealogy.

Grants are awarded based on proposed project's relevance to the purpose of Mennonite Genealogy, Inc., the feasibility of the project, and the deliverable outcome of the project.

Awards will be made semi-annually by the organization's board of directors. Expedited applications will be accepted where there is a time-sensitive opportunity or the documents in question might be in peril.

The next application deadlines are 1 August 2025 and 1 February 2026 with award announcements by 1 September 2025 and 1 March 2026.

Proposals will be evaluated by the MGI Grant Committee appointed by the MGI Board. The criteria will include:

- the importance of the information to be acquired to genealogists, historians, and the Low German Mennonite and Hutterite community.
- the commitment of skills and time to the project by the principal investigator and by co-investigators or contractors.
- the quality and completeness of the plan for the acquisition, organization, and publication of the acquired information.
- a plan to digitize and house the obtained information in the archives of a Mennonite center and to make it available in a digital format that is publicly searchable; this should be demonstrated with a letter of support from the director or archivist or a Mennonite centre. Translated genealogical materials will be made available on the Mennonite Genealogy Resources website (mgr.mennonitegenealogy.com).

Project Financials

Up to \$15,000 US may be awarded in a single grant. Funds will be distributed after expenses have been incurred and receipts for expenses have been received.

Requirements and Restrictions

- Funds may not be used for salaries of the principal investigator (for example, North Americans employed as university/college faculty).
- Funds may be used for research assistants, both North American and beyond, who are paid hourly or on a limited contract basis.
- Funds may be used to cover travel costs and accommodations.
- Documents that are acquired must be digitized, housed, and available online in the archives of a Mennonite center and in a publicly searchable format, unless restricted by the source archive (documents must still be available for private research purposes).
- The grant may last for up to three years (extensions may be granted upon request).
- A brief progress report (less than one page) is required each year.
- A final report will include accomplishments, itemized expenditures, and the online location of the resultant information and documents if applicable.
